







SUCCED study recruitment: Can you help us?

What is the study?

The <u>SUCCEED Study</u> is preparing for the <u>possibility that self-sampling may become an option in cervical screening</u> (otherwise known as a smear). The aim of the study is to recommend how to make a decision aid so that <u>people could make the right decision for themselves</u> between having a clinician carry out their cervical screening (as is done now) or doing a self-sample (likely a vaginal swab which does not need to reach the cervix, that someone can do themselves at home). We want any recommendations to be as <u>inclusive</u> as possible, so that it could support people from a variety of experiences, faiths and communities from groups who are often under-represented in research.

Who do you want to speak to?

We have interviewed individuals who are eligible for screening and now need to interview stakeholders. **Stakeholders** wouldn't speak to their personal cervical screening experiences but reflect on their work and would include:

- Those involved in cervical screening, such as nurses who take the sample.
- **Community or faith leaders** who could speak to their experiences of **supporting people** with cervical screening and / or sexual health.
- Third sector organisations who can speak about experiences of supporting people with various experiences or identities, such as those who have experienced sexual violence, with sexual health and / or cervical screening.

If you feel you (or someone you know, please do pass this along) may have experiences that mean you could be a stakeholder in the SUCCEED study, **please do get in touch**.

What would you want me to do?

We would arrange a time that works for you to have an interview **online**, over Zoom. They take up to an hour but we can work to what you have available. The interview would be a guided **conversation** focussed on your experiences related to the study. Unfortunately we can not pay for your time in this study but we really **appreciate any time you give** and are keen to include many perspectives.
